

# 2. Nations That Rebel Against God Will Fall

History bears witness—kingdoms that rise in defiance against God always collapse. The oncemighty cities of Moab and Bozrah were warned, yet they refused to turn, and His judgment swept over them like a storm. No nation is beyond the reach of His wings.

□ **Application:** Do not align yourself with systems or movements that reject God. Stand firm in right-eousness, and His wings will shield you in the day of judgment.

# 3. God's Judgment Brings a Great Shaking

In Ezekiel's vision, the Cherubim lifted their wings, and the earth trembled. When God moves in judgment, nations shake, thrones are overturned, and only that which is built on Christ remains standing. His wings do not move without purpose—they carry out His will, shaking everything that opposes Him.

☐ <b>Application:</b> Is your life built on <b>temporary things</b> or on the eternal foundation of Christ? When the shaking comes, <b>will you remain standing?</b>
Which Side of His Wings Will You Stand Under?
The <b>heirloom of divine justice</b> is both a covering of mercy and a force of judgment. The choice is yours. Will you take <b>refuge under His wings</b> , or will you stand in opposition and <b>face His righteous wrath</b> ?
□ Let the fear of the Lord guide you. His wings can either protect you or judge you—choose righteousness, and you will dwell under His divine covering!

### Wings of Triumph & Deliverance – Your Heirloom of Victory.

### Wings That Lift You to Victory

Life's trials can feel like prisons—traps set by the enemy, storms that threaten to overwhelm, or battles that seem unending. But God has never called His heirs to remain bound by oppression. Instead, He provides wings of triumph—divine deliverance that lifts His people above the enemy's reach.

These wings are not merely a poetic symbol; they are a spiritual reality, an heirloom passed down to every believer who seeks refuge in God. Just as an eagle soars above the storm, and a dove flies to safety, so will the Lord carry you into victory.

Whether you are enduring a wilderness season, a relentless battle, or a storm that refuses to cease, God's wings are your way out! He does not leave His people stranded—He provides an escape and a pathway to deliverance and rest.

#### 2. God's Wings Bring Beauty & Restoration

Psalm 68:13 speaks of wings covered in silver and gold, a sign of divine transformation. You may have been through trials, but your suffering will not define you. God does not leave His warriors in the dust—He restores, beautifies, and clothes you with honor.

☐ **Application:** Are you dwelling on past wounds or failures? **Let go of the ashes of yesterday**—God is giving you **new wings of victory and glory!** 

#### 3. God's Wings Hide & Protect You

Song of Solomon 2:14 describes **a dove hidden in the clefts of the rock**, symbolizing safety and intimacy with God. ☐ Application: Facing intense spiritual warfare? Rest under His wings and trust that He is your defense. The battle is not yours—it belongs to the Lord.

The heirloom of **triumph and deliverance** is not something you strive for—it is **your inheritance in Christ**. His wings **lift you out of trouble, restore your dignity, and shield you from the enemy's reach**.

### Holy Spirit – Wings of God for Us

He is the very breath of God, the wind beneath our wings, and the divine power that enables us to soar in the kingdom. Without Him, we are powerless—like a bird without wings. But with Him, we rise, move, and operate in both the **fruits** and **gifts** He bestows upon us.

The Holy Spirit is not merely an influence; He is God Himself, dwelling in us, guiding us, correcting us, and empowering us. He is the source of both **character** and **power**—the two wings that allow us to soar in our divine calling.

#### The Wings That Carry You in the Spirit

### 1. Two Wings of the Holy Spirit: Fruits & Gifts

I remember when I was reading WITH GOD THE HOLY SPIRIT by Dr. I. Emi. M. Petricia, there was a powerful revelation about how the Holy Spirit gives us two wings to soar:

#### The First Wing - The Fruits of the Spirit

#### (**Galatians** 5:22-23)

These are the **character** of Christ formed in us—love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Without this wing, we may have power but lack the godly nature required to sustain it.

#### The Second Wing - The Gifts of the Spirit

(1 Corinthians 12:8-10) These are **supernatural abilities** given by the Holy Spirit—wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, miracles, prophecy, discernment, tongues, and interpretation. Without this wing, we may have a godly character but lack the power to demonstrate the kingdom.

☐ **Application:** Are you flying with both wings? Some believers pursue power without character, while others focus on character without moving in power. But to truly soar, you need both!

#### 2. Relying on the Spirit, Not on Ourselves

I still remember when I was writing my first book, GOD's BATTLE AXE - From Dust to Steel; Forged for War. I was so excited that instead of praying or talking to God, my thoughts were constantly on the book.

One day, as I sat for prayer, I had a vision where I stood at the **throne of God**, wearing all the **heir-looms of God**. But suddenly, my thoughts drifted back to the book I was writing. At that moment, I heard a **loud voice from God** correcting me:

"Entertain not the seed of pride in you, my son... it is through the wings of My Spirit you are able to do My Kingdom's work."

Instantly, conviction gripped my heart. I realized I had started relying on my own strength instead of the Holy Spirit. I <b>wept and repented</b> , crying out:
☐ "Cast me not away from thy presence; and take not thy Holy Spirit from me." (Psalms 51:11)
□ <b>Application:</b> Are you relying on your own strength to do God's work? Even the best intentions, when disconnected from the Holy Spirit, can lead to pride. True kingdom work can only be done by <b>His Spirit</b> , <b>not our ability</b> (Zechariah 4:6).
3. Living Under the Wings of the Holy Spirit
The Holy Spirit is not just an occasional visitor— He is our <b>eternal helper</b> , our <b>divine covering</b> , and our <b>source of power</b> . His wings do not merely shelter us; they lift us into supernatural realms of <b>intimacy</b> , <b>wisdom</b> , <b>and power</b> .
☐ Will you spread your wings and allow the Spirit to carry you higher? The more you surrender, the higher you will soar!
Come, Holy Spirit! Let Your wings cover us and lift us into Your divine purpose. $\Box\Box$

### Practical Exercise

# Soaring with the Wings of the Holy Spirit

### 2

### **THE ROD**

Among the divine heirlooms bestowed upon God's people, the **Rod** stands as a symbol of authority, correction, guidance, and supernatural power. From the shepherd's staff in David's hand to the rod of Moses that split the Red Sea, this sacred instrument carries immense spiritual significance. It is a tool of discipline and leadership, a sign of divine rulership, and a weapon of deliverance.

The **Rod** appears **86 times** in the King James Version (KJV) of the Bible, consistently revealing its role in executing God's will—whether for protection, correction, or judgment. As heirs of God's kingdom, we must understand and wield this heirloom with wisdom, recognizing its purpose in both our personal walk and our mission for Christ.

This passage will unveil the prophetic archetypes of **God's Rod**, its functions in Scripture, and how it applies to our lives today. Let us step into the revelation of this powerful heirloom and learn to carry the **Rod of God** with faith and obedience.

# Types of God's Rod: The Many Forms of Divine Authority

Throughout Scripture, the **Rod** appears as a powerful emblem of God's authority, discipline, and rulership. It is not merely a shepherd's tool but an instrument of divine power, correction, and judgment. The **Rod** is the second heirloom of God's kingdom, given to His people for guidance, protection, and enforcement of His will.

The **Rod** appears **86 times in the KJV**, revealing its deep significance in different contexts. In this episode, we will explore the **various types of God's Rod** in the Bible and their meaning for us today.

### 1. The Rod of Authority – The Scepter of Kingship

☐ "The sceptre shall not depart from Judah, nor a lawgiver from between his feet, until Shiloh come." (Genesis 49:10)

The Rod, or **scepter**, represents **royal authority and dominion**. Kings rule with a rod, symbolizing their right to govern. In prophecy, Jesus Christ is

the ultimate King who holds the <b>Rod of authority</b> over all creation.
☐ <b>Application</b> : As heirs of God's kingdom, we are called to rule with Christ. We must walk in the authority He has given us.
2. The Rod of Miracles – The Rod of Moses
☐ "And thou shalt take this rod in thine hand, wherewith thou shalt do signs." (Exodus 4:17)

☐ "Withhold not correction from the child: for if thou beatest him with the rod, he shall not die." (Proverbs 23:13)

☐ "Thy rod and thy staff they comfort me." (Psalms 23:4)

Though we often think of <b>comfort</b> as soft and gentle, the <b>Rod brings security</b> because it assures us of God's guidance and protection. It defends against enemies and keeps us on the right path.
☐ <b>Application</b> : Trust in the security of God's Rod. He will not leave you without guidance.

### The Rod of Authority — The Scepter of Kingship

One of the most powerful symbols of God's **Rod** in the Bible is the **Scepter of Kingship**—a **Rod of Authority** given to rule and reign. This heirloom is not just a physical object but a prophetic sign of divine **governance**, **dominion**, and **rulership**. It represents the authority **God bestows upon His chosen ones**, from the patriarchs of Israel to the Messiah Himself.

As believers, we are called to **walk in this divine authority**, wielding the **Rod of God's Kingdom** in righteousness. But what does this mean for us to-day?

2. The Rod of Kings – Establishing Divine Rule  "Thou shalt break them with a rod of iron; thou shalt dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel." (Psalms 2:9)
The Rod of Authority is not only a symbol of righteous rulership but also of divine judgment over rebellion. Kings wield rods to enforce justice and uphold the laws of the kingdom. Jesus Christ, as the King of Kings, will rule with a rod of iron, establishing righteousness and justice on the earth.
□ <b>Application</b> : Are you submitting to <b>God's rule</b> in your life? True authority comes through submission to <b>His will</b> . The more we align with His rule, the more we walk in divine power.

### 3. Aaron's Rod – Divine Confirmation of Authority

□ "And it came to pass, that on the morrow Moses went into the tabernacle of witness; and, behold, the rod of Aaron for the house of Levi was budded, and brought forth buds, and bloomed blossoms, and yielded almonds." (Numbers 17:8)

When Korah and his followers rebelled against Moses and Aaron, God confirmed His chosen leader by making Aaron's rod bud, blossom, and bear fruit overnight. This supernatural sign proved that Aaron and the Levites were appointed by God to lead.

□ Application: God confirms His chosen ones. If you are called to leadership in any area—spiritually or otherwise—let God's anointing be your proof. You don't need to force your way into authority; God will make your rod bud in His timing.

### 4. Christ's Scepter – Righteousness & Justice

☐ "A sceptre of righteousness is the sceptre of thy kingdom." (Hebrews 1:8)

Unlike earthly rulers who sometimes **abuse power**, Christ's rule is established in **righteousness and justice**. His scepter—**His Rod of Authority**—is not **corrupt or oppressive** but **holy, just, and true**.

☐ Application: We, too, must wield authority with righteousness. Whether in ministry, leadership, or daily life, our actions should reflect the justice and integrity of Christ's rule.
Are You Ready to Carry the Rod of Authority?
As God's heirs, we are <b>not called to be weak</b> but to <b>rule with Christ</b> . However, divine authority comes with responsibility:

### The Rod of Miracles – The Rod of Moses

Throughout Scripture, God has used **ordinary objects** to demonstrate His **extraordinary power**. One of the most powerful heirlooms of divine intervention was placed in the hands of a man named **Moses**—the **Rod of Miracles**.

At first, this rod seemed like just a shepherd's staff, a tool of the wilderness. But in God's hands, it became a symbol of deliverance, power, and signs and wonders. What was once a simple rod turned into a weapon against Pharaoh, a tool of divine authority, and a banner of victory over the forces of darkness.

Today, we, too, have been given the Rod of Miracles—God's supernatural power at work in and through us. But are we willing to step out in faith and wield it?

The Rod That Split the Sea - Pathway to Deliverance ☐ "Lift thou up thy rod, and stretch out thine hand over the sea, and divide it: and the children of Israel shall go on dry ground." (Exodus 14:16) As the Israelites stood before the **Red Sea**, with Pharaoh's army closing in, God commanded Moses to **lift his rod**. That simple act of obedience resulted in one of the greatest miracles in history—the sea parted, and the Israelites walked through on dry land. ☐ **Application**: When you feel trapped, remember God's rod of miracles still works today. Lift up

your faith, take a step, and watch God make a way

where there is none!

#### 3. The Rod That Drew Water from the Rock — Provision in the Wilderness

□ "And thou shalt smite the rock, and there shall come water out of it, that the people may drink." (Exodus 17:6)

In the wilderness, when the people cried out for water, God told Moses to strike the rock with the rod. In obedience, he did so, and water gushed forth, providing for the entire nation. This miracle foreshadowed Christ, the Rock, being struck for our salvation, bringing forth living water for all who thirst.

□ Application: If you are in a dry season, trust that God can bring provision out of impossible places. The rod in Moses' hand was a reminder that God always provides.

#### 4. The Rod Lifted in Battle -

### Victory Over Amalek

☐ "And it came to pass, when Moses held up his hand, that Israel prevailed: and when he let down his hand, Amalek prevailed." (Exodus 17:11)

As the Israelites battled the Amalekites, **Moses lifted up the rod**, and as long as it was raised, Israel was victorious. This shows that **spiritual victory is** 

won when we rely on God's power, not our own strength.
☐ Application: Are you in a spiritual battle? Lift up your rod in prayer and worship. Victory comes when we depend on God's strength, not our own.
The Rod of Miracles in Your Hands
The Rod of Moses is not just a story—it is a prophetic heirloom for us today. The same God of miracles is still working through His people. But He requires obedience, faith, and boldness.
$\hfill\Box$ The Rod of Miracles is in your hands. Will you use it? $\hfill\Box$

### The Rod of Judgment – God's Instrument of Correction

The Rod of Judgment is one of the most fearsome heirlooms in God's arsenal. While we often think of a rod as a symbol of authority or miracles, it is also God's instrument of discipline, correction, and justice. Throughout Scripture, we see the rod used to chastise, rebuke, and bring divine judgment upon the rebellious.

God's judgment is never random or without cause—it is always **righteous**, **measured**, **and intended to lead people back to Him**. When nations, kings, or even His own people strayed from His commands, the rod of judgment swiftly followed.

This **rod still exists today**—not just as a warning to the wicked but as a tool to purify and refine God's people.

#### 1. The Rod That Struck Egypt – Judgment on a Rebellious Nation

☐ "And Moses stretched forth his rod toward heaven: and the LORD sent thunder and hail, and the

fire ran along upon the ground; and the LORD rained hail upon the land of Egypt." (Exodus 9:23)

Egypt, under Pharaoh's rule, refused to heed God's command to let His people go. As a result, God instructed Moses to stretch out his rod, and judgment fell upon the land in the form of plagues. The waters turned to blood, locusts devoured crops, darkness covered the land, and hail rained down with fire—all executed through the rod of divine judgment.

□ Application: Just as Egypt ignored God's warnings, many today harden their hearts against Him. But when God's rod of judgment is lifted, no one can stand against it. Are you walking in obedience, or resisting God's commands?

# 2. The Rod That Punished Israel – Discipline for God's People

 $\Box$  "Then will I visit their transgression with the rod, and their iniquity with stripes." (Psalms 89:32)

God's rod is not just for the **ungodly nations**—He also **disciplines His own people** when they go astray. When Israel rebelled, worshipped idols, and abandoned the covenant, they faced **exile**, **defeat**, **and hardship**. However, this was not out of hatred but **out of love**, **to bring them back to repentance**.

☐ Application: If you feel God's discipline in your life, do not resist it. His correction is a sign of His love. Just as a father corrects a child, God chastens those He loves (Hebrews 12:6).
3. The Rod That Destroyed the Wicked – Judg~ ment Against Oppression
☐ "Thou shalt break them with a rod of iron; thou shalt dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel." (Psalms 2:9)
In the final judgment, the wicked will not stand. The Rod of Iron is a symbol of Christ's authority when He returns to rule over the nations. Those who persist in rebellion, reject God's salvation, and oppress His people will be broken by His rod of judgment.
□ Application: Jesus is returning to establish His kingdom. The question is—are you ready to stand before Him, or will you be found on the side of judgment?
4. The Rod That Brings Repentance – A Call to Return to God
☐ "Hear ye the rod, and who hath appointed it." (Micah 6:9)

Even when God wields <b>His rod of judgment</b> , His ultimate desire is not destruction but <b>repentance</b> . His corrections are always meant to <b>turn hearts</b> back to <b>Him</b> before it is too late.
☐ Application: If you are experiencing God's discipline, do not ignore it. Humble yourself, repent, and return to Him—before the rod falls heavier.
The Rod of Judgment in Our Time

### The Rod of Correction – Discipline for God's Children

They represent the ultimate reward for those who remain steadfast in Christ, enduring trials and fulfilling His purpose on earth.

Just as earthly kings and rulers wear crowns to signify their authority, God bestows heavenly crowns upon His children as a mark of their inheritance in His kingdom. These crowns are not temporary but eternal, symbolizing our divine calling, our faithfulness, and our ultimate victory in Christ.

In this passage, we will explore the various crowns mentioned in Scripture, their prophetic significance, and how they relate to our journey as heirs of God's kingdom. Let us prepare to receive our heavenly crowns, for they are part of the great inheritance promised to us in Christ Jesus.

# Types of Crowns – The Heirlooms of Eternal Reward


The question is: Will the next generation receive the heirlooms of wisdom, or will they be lost?







Each of these aspects of God's Word corresponds to the heirlooms we receive as His children. These are not relics of the past but living treasures that shape us into Christ-like warriors and sons of the Most High.

## 1. The Law of the Lord — The Guiding Staff of God

☐ "The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul."

— Psalm 19:7a (NKJV)

The law of the Lord is God's divine standard—His guidance for His people. Just as a shepherd's staff directs and protects the sheep, so does God's law lead us in righteousness and prevent us from straying.
