Every time Jesus spoke, there was a **tangible effect** in the physical and spiritual realms. The elements obeyed Him, sickness fled at His command, and the demonic trembled at His voice. Sickness and disease were never able to resist the authority of Jesus' words. One of the most striking examples is found in Matthew 8:8-10, where a Roman centurion comes to Jesus on behalf of his sick servant:

"The centurion answered and said, 'Lord, I am not worthy that You should come under my roof. But only speak a word, and my servant will be healed."

This centurion understood a principle that many believers still struggle to grasp—distance does not limit the power of the spoken Word. Jesus did not need to physically touch the servant; He simply spoke, and the healing manifested instantly.

Scripture confirms the result in Matthew 8:13: "Then Jesus said to the centurion, 'Go your way; and as you have believed, so let it be done for you.' And his servant was healed that same hour."

God had placed a **hedge of divine protection** around Job, making it impossible for Satan to touch him. This hedge was only removed when a legal ground was presented. Likewise, our words **either reinforce God's hedge of protection or break it down**, allowing the enemy to enter.

Many believers unknowingly **break their divine hedge** by speaking words such as:

- "I'll never be free from this addiction."
- "I'm always struggling."
- "Nothing ever works out for me."

These are **demonic agreements** because they contradict God's promises. The enemy takes such words as **spiritual permission** to bring destruction.

Biblical Examples of Prophetic Declarations Breaking Agreements

Throughout Scripture, we see that **spoken words** have the power to cancel demonic decrees and establish divine realities.

1. King Hezekiah Cancels the Sentence of Death

In Isaiah 38, King Hezekiah received a prophetic word from Isaiah:

"Set thine house in order: for thou shalt die, and not live." (Isaiah 38:1)

However, Hezekiah refused to accept this decree. Instead, he turned to God and declared:

"O Lord, remember now how I have walked before thee in truth and with a perfect heart, and have done that which is good in thy sight." (Isaiah 38:3)

Through this **prophetic declaration**, he broke the agreement with death, and God **extended his life by 15 years**. This proves that even if a decree has been made in the spirit realm, it **can be overturned through prophetic prayer**.

During His temptation in the wilderness, Jesus did not entertain Satan's words—He countered them immediately with the written Word:

- "If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread."
 - Jesus replied: "It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone."
 (Matthew 4:3-4)
- "If thou be the Son of God, cast thyself down."
 - Jesus replied: "It is written again, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God." (Matthew 4:6-7)

Jesus taught us that the enemy's lies **must not be** tolerated or left unanswered. They must be confronted with prophetic truth.

3. The Prophet Elijah Cancels Jezebel's Curse

Jezebel issued a death threat against Elijah, saying:

"So let the gods do to me, and more also, if I make not thy life as the life of one of them by tomorrow about this time." (1 Kings 19:2) This was a **demonic decree**—a spoken curse meant to bring fear and destruction. However, Elijah's later **prophetic confrontation and decree** resulted in Jezebel's downfall (2 Kings 9:33-37).

These examples show that **spoken decrees carry legal weight in the spirit**—but through prophetic declarations, every false agreement **can be broken**.

How to Identify and Break Demonic Agreements

The first step in breaking demonic agreements is **identifying** where they exist. This requires spiritual discernment and revelation from the Holy Spirit. There are **four primary areas** where demonic agreements can be found:

1. Words Spoken Over Yourself

- Negative words you have declared about yourself
- Words spoken in frustration, pain, or fear

2. Words Spoken by Others

- Curses or negative words spoken over you by family, friends, or spiritual authorities
- Harmful labels placed on you (e.g., "You will always fail.")

3. Words Spoken in Agreement with Sin

- Confessions that align with bondage, addiction, or sickness
- Speaking defeat instead of victory

Once identified, these agreements must be **broken through prophetic declarations**.

Angels are not randomly deployed, nor do they act on human emotions. Psalm 103:20 declares:

This is why it is essential to understand how prophetic proclamations **activate angelic intervention**.

"From tonight onward, the child shall consume a full meal. I, the Lord your God, have done it before the appointed time, for My grace abides."
