

Episode 1: The Origin of the Voice

In the beginning, before the birth of time, before the stars burned with their first light, and before creation exhaled its first breath—there was a Voice. This Voice did not emerge from the void, nor was it shaped by existence, for it was existence itself. It was the uncreated sound, the eternal resonance of the Almighty.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." (John 1:1)

Before anything was ever seen or touched, **the**Voice of God filled the realm of eternity. It was neither an echo nor a vibration—it was **pure**authority, raw creative power, the very essence of God. It did not originate—it always was. It did not develop—it always reigned.

The Israelites could not endure the weight of His Voice; they begged Moses to speak instead (**Exodus 20:19**). Why? Because when God speaks, **flesh cannot remain comfortable**. His Voice exposes, convicts, uproots, and consumes everything that is **not aligned with His holiness**.

God's prophetic Voice carries the same nature today—it challenges darkness, purifies the vessel, and ignites revival.

The Prophet & The Furnace

Every prophet is first **forged in fire** before they carry it. Before Isaiah could speak on behalf of God, he had to be **purified by the coal from the altar**.

"Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a live coal which he had taken with the tongs from the altar. And he touched my mouth with it, and said: 'Behold, this has touched your lips; your iniquity is taken away, and your sin purged.'" (Isaiah 6:6-7)

Notice: Before Isaiah could declare God's words, his own mouth had to be cleansed by fire. This is

the prophet's furnace—the burning away of self before becoming the Voice of God.

If you desire to **speak for God**, be prepared to **be refined by God**. He does not entrust His Voice to those who **cling to their own agendas**.

"Is not My word like a fire?" says the Lord, "And like a hammer that breaks the rock in pieces?" (Jeremiah 23:29)

A true prophetic vessel does not dilute the fire of God's Voice to make it comfortable for men. It is either received in repentance or rejected in rebellion—but it will never be ignored.

The Fire That Consumes & Builds

Jeremiah was a man who could not contain the fire of God's Voice:

"Then I said, 'I will not make mention of Him, nor speak anymore in His name.' But His word was in my heart like a burning fire shut up in my bones; I was weary of holding it back, and I could not." (Jeremiah 20:9)

The fire of the prophetic Voice does not allow silence. It will **burn within until it is released**. But notice—this fire does not only **consume**; it also **builds**.

The fire of God's Voice destroys strongholds and establishes heaven's will. Those who carry it must be unshaken, unafraid, and unwavering.


Will You Carry the Fire?

- **Isaiah** prophesied the rise of Cyrus long before he was born.
- **Daniel** interpreted dreams that shaped entire empires.

Prophets do not just speak to **individuals**—they speak to **systems**, **governments**, **and territories**. They are **watchmen on the walls of nations**.

The Cost of Being Set Apart

A Final Charge


To be set apart for nations means:

The Spirit of Prophecy Is the Atmosphere of Heaven

The Weight of a Prophetic Word

When a prophet speaks, it is not his own words that carry weight, but the authority of the One who sent him.

• Moses was commanded to speak to Pharaoh with boldness, declaring, "Thus says the Lord." (Exodus 5:1)

- Ezekiel was told to eat the scroll and speak only what God put in his mouth. (Ezekiel 3:1-4)
- Jeremiah was given words that would uproot, destroy, build, and plant nations. (Jeremiah 1:10)

A prophet's words shape destinies, shift atmospheres, and establish the decrees of heaven. This is why **prophetic obedience is not optional—it is the very foundation of the office**.

The Danger of Altering the Message

"Do not add to His words, lest He rebuke you and you be found a liar." (Proverbs 30:6)

Why the Wilderness Is Necessary

A prophet **is not made in palaces or among crowds**—he is forged in isolation. The wilderness:

 - Prophets must speak what God says, not what people want to hear.
 - Isolation removes the temptation to seek validation from man.

 - Many desire a platform, but few are willing to endure obscurity.

Even John the Baptist, **who prepared the way for Jesus**, had a moment of doubt in prison:

"Then Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit to Galilee, and news of Him went out through all the surrounding region." (Luke 4:14)

- Jesus entered the wilderness filled with the Spirit.
- He exited in the power of the Spirit.

The wilderness does not weaken a prophet—it **empowers** him. When you emerge, you will carry:

- **A purified voice**—untainted by personal ambition.
- A sharpened discernment—trained to recognize the whispers of heaven.

Episode 10: The Gift of Prophecy Is for All, But Not All Are Prophets

"Pursue love, and desire spiritual gifts, but especially that you may prophesy." (1 Corinthians 14:1)

The prophetic dimension is vast, yet many confuse the gift of prophecy with the office of a prophet. While all believers are encouraged to desire and operate in the prophetic gift, not all are called to walk in the governmental weight of the prophetic office.

The enemy thrives on deception, and one of his greatest strategies is **blurring the lines between the gift and the office**, causing many to either **reject the prophetic** altogether or claim an office they were never assigned.

To bring clarity, we must distinguish:

- The Gift of Prophecy: Available to all believers, functioning as the Spirit wills.
- The Office of a Prophet: A divine ordination, established by God, carrying governmental authority.

The Gift of Prophecy: Available to All

"And it shall come to pass afterward that I will pour out My Spirit on all flesh; your sons and your daughters shall prophesy..." (Joel 2:28)

The **gift of prophecy** is one of the manifestations of the Holy Spirit. Paul instructs believers to **desire spiritual gifts, especially prophecy** (*1 Corinthians 14:1*), indicating that **prophecy is not reserved for a select few** but is available to all who seek it.

Characteristics of the Gift of Prophecy:

- 1. Given as the Spirit Wills
 - The gift operates under the discretion of the Holy Spirit, not human control.
 - No one can "turn it on" at will—it is a divine inspiration, not a learned skill.
- 2. Primarily for Edification, Exhortation, and Comfort
 - "He who prophesies speaks edification and exhortation and comfort to men." (1 Corinthians 14:3)
 - It strengthens the body of Christ, bringing hope, correction, and encouragement.
- 3. Limited Authority
 - Those who operate in the gift of prophecy do not carry governmental authority.

 Their words must be weighed, tested, and judged by those established in leadership (1 Corinthians 14:29).

4. Not a Sign of a Prophetic Calling

- Many who prophesy assume they are called to be prophets, but this is a grave mistake.
- A believer may prophesy on occasion, yet never hold the office of a prophet.

The gift is a function, but the office is a calling.

The Office of a Prophet: A Divine Appointment

"And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers." (Ephesians 4:11)

The office of a prophet is not given to all believers. It is a sovereign appointment, established by God's choosing—not by human ambition.

Characteristics of the Office of a Prophet:

1. Called from the Womb

True prophets are not self-appointed; they are **chosen before birth** (*Jeremiah 1:5*).

Many, desiring spiritual prominence, mistake the gift of prophecy for the office of a prophet. They prematurely call themselves prophets, not realizing the weight and cost of this mantle.

The Consequences of False Prophetic Claims:

1. Spiritual Warfare You Are Not Equipped For

- The prophetic office attracts principalities and demonic attacks.
- If God has not called you, you are stepping into a battle you are not anointed to fight.

2. Speaking Presumptuously

- Many who claim to be prophets begin to speak from their own minds, not from God (*Jeremiah* 23:16).
- False prophecies bring confusion and destruction.

3. Severe Judgment from God

- God holds prophets to a higher standard of accountability.
- o Those who falsely claim the office **bring judgment upon themselves** (*Deuteronomy 18:20*).

Testing the Calling: Are You a Prophet or Do You Simply Prophesy?

If you feel drawn to the prophetic, ask yourself these questions:

Do you carry the burden of nations?

- Has God personally spoken to you about a prophetic calling?
- Have you gone through seasons of intense refinement, isolation, and training?
- Has your prophetic accuracy been tested and proven?
- Are you submitted to spiritual authority for confirmation and accountability?

If you are unsure, wait upon the Lord. Do not rush into a title God has not given you.

"Do not be hasty in the laying on of hands, nor share in other people's sins; keep yourself pure." (1 Timothy 5:22)

A Final Word: Walk in What God Has Given You

Not everyone is called to be a prophet. **And that is okay.**

The body of Christ is diverse, with many roles, anointings, and functions. If God has given you the gift of prophecy, cherish it and use it faithfully—but do not assume a mantle He has not placed upon you.

Let us pray:

"Father, let me walk in the calling You have ordained for me. If I am called as a prophet, refine me and prepare me. If I am gifted in prophecy, teach me to use it in humility. Keep me from ambition and deception, and let me serve You in truth. In Jesus' name, Amen."

Episode 11: The Marks of a True Prophet

"You will know them by their fruits." (Matthew 7:16)

In every generation, God raises true prophets, but alongside them arise false prophets, self-appointed messengers, and deceivers. The question then arises: how do we distinguish a true prophet from a counterfeit?

A prophet is not recognized by title, charisma, or following, but by fruit, divine confirmation, and alignment with the voice of God.

A true prophet does not seek validation from men. Their authority is not self-proclaimed, but heaven-ordained.

1. A True Prophet Is Called and Sent by God

"Before I formed you in the womb I knew you; before you were born I sanctified you; I ordained you a prophet to the nations." (Jeremiah 1:5)

No one **chooses to become a prophet**. It is not a career, ambition, or ministry preference. It is a **predestined ordination from before birth**.

Key Signs of a Divine Calling:

- God Himself calls the prophet, not men.
- There is a clear moment of commissioning—an encounter, vision, or divine instruction.
- The call comes with a burden—a weight that cannot be ignored.

Moses was not seeking to be a prophet. **God called** him.

If God has not sent you, you have no authority to speak.

2. A True Prophet Speaks the Words of God Alone

"For I have not spoken on My own authority; but the Father who sent Me gave Me a command, what I should say and what I should speak." (John 12:49)

A prophet does not speak their own opinions, desires, or ambitions.

Every word they utter must align with the heart and voice of God.

The Marks of True Prophetic Speech:

- **It carries divine weight**—not empty motivation, but revelation.

- It does not seek to please men, but to declare truth.

False prophets prophesy what people want to hear. True prophets prophesy what God is saying, even when it offends.

3. A True Prophet's Words Come to Pass

"When a prophet speaks in the name of the Lord, if the thing does not happen or come to pass, that is the thing which the Lord has not spoken; the prophet has spoken it presumptuously." (Deuteronomy 18:22)

The **accuracy of a prophet's words** is a direct indicator of whether they are speaking from God.

Testing a Prophecy:

- **Does it align with Scripture?** (God will never contradict Himself.)
- **Does it come to pass?** (A true word of the Lord does not fail.)

False prophets **speak from imagination**, but a true prophet speaks **from divine revelation**.

4. A True Prophet Carries the Burden of God

"You shall be holy, for I the Lord your God am holy." (Leviticus 19:2)

- They walk in humility, not arrogance.

"By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples." (John 15:8)

Episode 12: Prophetic Mantles & Their Assignments

"And He gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors, and some teachers, for the equipping of the saints for the work of ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ." (Ephesians 4:11-12)

The prophetic mantle is **not a generic calling**; each prophet carries **a specific assignment** within the divine order. Not all prophets are the same. **Each is assigned a unique sphere, function, and mandate from God.**

Throughout Scripture, we see various prophetic mantles—each carrying a distinct role, authority, and purpose. To understand where one stands in the prophetic, it is necessary to discern the mantle given by God.

1. The Mantle of the Foundational Prophet

"Having been built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the chief cornerstone." (Ephesians 2:20)

These are **prophets who lay the foundation** for spiritual movements, churches, or divine reformations. They **operate in governmental**

authority and are entrusted with the blueprint of God's plans.

Biblical Examples:

- Moses Established the covenantal law.
- Samuel Transitioned Israel into kingdom governance.
- John the Baptist Prepared the way for Christ.

Signs of a Foundational Prophet:

- They set order in the body of Christ.
- They carry the architecture of heaven for new moves of God.

These prophets pioneer, establish, and ensure divine order.

2. The Mantle of the Seer Prophet

"The prophet that has a dream, let him tell a dream; and he that has My word, let him speak My word faithfully." (Jeremiah 23:28)

The Seer prophets operate in visions, dreams, trances, and deep revelatory encounters. Their

role is to **see beyond the natural realm** and decode the mysteries of God.

Biblical Examples:

- **Daniel** Interpreted dreams and visions.

These prophets operate at a national and governmental level. They are sent to speak to

These prophets **operate in high-level dominion**, speaking directly to rulers and shaping the course of history.

6. The Mantle of the Prophetic Psalmist

"Sing to Him a new song; play skillfully with a shout of joy." (Psalm 33:3)

These prophets release the **sound of heaven**, carrying **prophetic songs**, **melodies**, **and decrees** that shift atmospheres and bring deliverance.

Biblical Examples:

- **David** Released prophetic warfare through the Psalms.
- **Asaph** Led Israel in prophetic worship.
- Miriam Sang after the Red Sea miracle.

Signs of a Prophetic Psalmist:

- Their worship carries supernatural power.
- They release prophetic decrees through music.
- They shift atmospheres and break demonic oppression.

These prophets war with sound—using music as a weapon in the spirit.

The Weight of Carrying a Prophetic Mantle

"To whom much is given, from him much will be required." (Luke 12:48)

A prophetic mantle is **not a title—it is a burden**. Every prophet must:

1. **Know their mantle**—function in the sphere God assigned.

- 2. **Remain humble**—mantles do not make men great, obedience does.
- 3. **Walk in holiness**—gifts without character lead to destruction.

And behold, the LORD passed by, and a great and strong wind tore into the mountains and broke the rocks in pieces before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind; and after the wind an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake; and after the earthquake a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire; and after the fire a still small voice." — 1 Kings 19:11-12

The Dual Expression of God's Voice

God speaks in different dimensions, and each carries a specific purpose. Some hear Him in gentle whispers, while others encounter His voice as thunder. Both are necessary, for they reveal different aspects of His nature.

The Whisper—A Voice of Intimacy

When God speaks in a still small voice, it is an invitation into deep relationship. The whisper is for those who have ears to hear, who are close enough to discern the gentle nudges of the Holy Spirit.

Biblical Examples:

- 1. **Samuel** Heard God call his name in the night (*1 Samuel 3:4*).
- 2. **Elijah** Encountered God in a whisper, not in the storm (*1 Kings 19:12*).

- 2. Thunder is for those who need awakening—when God must act publicly.
- 3. The Whisper leads to revelation; The Thunder leads to movement.

Many desire to hear God in thunderous ways, yet neglect His whisper. A true prophet knows both expressions and learns when to listen and when to proclaim.

Are You Listening?

"The LORD thundered from heaven, and the Most High uttered His voice." (2 Samuel 22:14)

The same God who thunders in the heavens is the One who whispers to His prophets. His voice both stills and shakes, drawing men into intimacy and into action.

Episode 14: The Heart & The Ear

"He who has ears to hear, let him hear!" — Matthew 11:15

The Two Gateways to God's Voice

Hearing God is more than just receiving **audible words**—it is about perceiving His voice **in the heart and the ear**. A prophet must be trained in both.

- The Ear represents spiritual sensitivity—a trained ability to discern God's voice.
- The Heart represents alignment with God's will—a heart tuned to His frequency.

A prophet must develop **both** to accurately **hear**, **interpret**, **and deliver** the voice of God.

The Ear: A Spiritual Receiver

God speaks, but not everyone **hears** Him. Many have **ears but do not hear** because their spirits are **dull or distracted** (*Matthew 13:15*).

Episode 15: Echoing Heaven—Speaking with Divine Accuracy

"For I have not spoken on My own authority; but the Father who sent Me gave Me a command, what I should say and what I should speak." — John 12:49

Speaking What Heaven Declares

A prophet is not called to voice **personal opinions** but to **echo the declarations of heaven**. Divine accuracy in prophecy is not just about speaking, but about ensuring that **what is spoken aligns perfectly with God's intent**.

- True prophets speak only what they hear (John 8:26).
- A misplaced word can alter destinies (*Jeremiah 23:30-32*).
- God confirms His word, not man's opinion (*Isaiah 55:11*).

The weight of being God's mouthpiece requires **precision**, **obedience**, **and responsibility**.

Echoing vs. Interpreting

A prophet must learn the difference between **echoing** and **interpreting**:

- **Echoing** Repeating God's words exactly as given, without addition or omission (*Numbers* 22:38).
- Interpreting Filtering God's message through personal biases, emotions, or intellect (*Jeremiah 23:16*).

The Dangers of Imprecise Prophecy

- Example: Balaam, who tried to curse Israel against God's will (*Numbers* 22:12).

2. Adding to the Word of the Lord

- When a prophet **embellishes**, **exaggerates**, **or distorts** the message.
- Example: Hananiah, who prophesied falsely and died (*Jeremiah 28:15-17*).

3. Speaking When God Has Not Spoken

- Declaring "Thus says the Lord" when God has said nothing.
- Example: False prophets in Ezekiel's time (*Ezekiel 13:6-9*).

God holds prophets **accountable** for the accuracy of their words (*Deuteronomy 18:20*).

Keys to Prophetic Accuracy

- 1. **Only Speak What You Hear** (*Jeremiah* 1:7)
 - Even when pressured, a prophet must not alter the message.


- 2. Remain in the Presence of God (*John* 15:5)

Episode 16: The Lion's Roar

"The LORD also will roar from Zion, and utter His voice from Jerusalem; The heavens and earth will shake; but the LORD will be a shelter for His people, and the strength of the children of Israel."

— Joel 3:16

The Roar of the Almighty

When God speaks, His voice is **not a whisper of uncertainty**—it is a **roar that shakes the heavens and the earth**. The **Lion of Judah** does not murmur; He **decrees with finality**. His voice **demolishes, builds, commands, and establishes**.

- God's voice as thunder (Job 37:4-5).
- **His voice as many waters** (*Revelation* 1:15).
- His voice as a lion's roar (Hosea 11:10).

When a prophet is **aligned with heaven**, he carries this same **roaring authority**. Prophets are not raised to be **passive messengers**—they are called to **release the voice of the Lion** into the earth.

The Authority of the Roar

A lion's roar serves as:

- The Religious Roar—False Prophets (*Jeremiah 23:21-22*)

Only those who dwell in the **presence of the True Lion** will be able to **discern and release the authentic roar** of the Lord.

Becoming a Voice That Roars

- 5. Declare What is Written (Psalm 29:3-9)
 - God's Word is the roar—declaring Scripture with authority unleashes heaven's power.

The Roar That Shakes the Earth

When a prophet **fully aligns** with God's voice, his words will **shake systems, nations, and generations**. The voice of the Lord is:

- A fire that consumes (Jeremiah 5:14).

The Prophet as an Intercessor

A prophet is not only a voice that speaks but also a watchman that intercedes. Before declaring, a prophet must first perceive, receive, and birth the word in the place of prayer. Prophetic intercession is not just praying to God—it is praying with God, enforcing His will, and aligning with what is already written in the heavens.

- Moses stood in the gap for Israel (*Exodus* 32:11-14).
- Daniel interceded based on prophetic writings (Daniel 9:2-3).
- Jesus Himself is the Great Intercessor (*Hebrews 7:25*).

When a prophet intercedes, he is not speaking his own will but is echoing the decrees of heaven into the earth realm.

The Divine Legal System—Declaring What is Written

In the courts of heaven, God's Word is law. A prophetic intercessor does not pray from emotions but enforces what is already decreed in the Word.

- God moves according to His Word (*Isaiah* 55:11).
- Angels respond to His decrees (*Psalm* 103:20).
- The prophetic voice must declare divine legislation (*Jeremiah 1:12*).

When a prophet declares what is written, he activates angelic armies, shifts atmospheres, and shakes nations.

The Power of Speaking in Alignment

1. Prophetic Intercession Begins in the Spirit

On March 25, 2025, I returned, this time following His precise instruction. Placing my hand on Jaswant's belly, I commanded the affliction to leave in Jesus' name.

Then, as I prepared to pray again, the Lord spoke:

"As soon as you pray, I will heal him. Tell them the child will start eating after two days."

Faith requires obedience, even when the outcome is unseen. I told the caretakers what the Lord had said.

By March 28, 2025, Jaswant ate a full meal for the first time in days! The Lord had fulfilled His word.

Through this, I learned a valuable truth: **Prophetic accuracy is not about assumption but about listening to God's Voice with precision.** Had I continued in my own understanding, the struggle would have remained. **Deliverance is not in our words, but in His.**

This is the calling of every true prophet—to **hear**, **obey**, **and declare** what God has spoken. The prophetic is not about performance but about partnership with His Voice.

May this testimony stir you to seek the Lord's Voice above all else. For when He speaks, the impossible becomes possible.

Author's Testimony 2: The Voice That Heals
